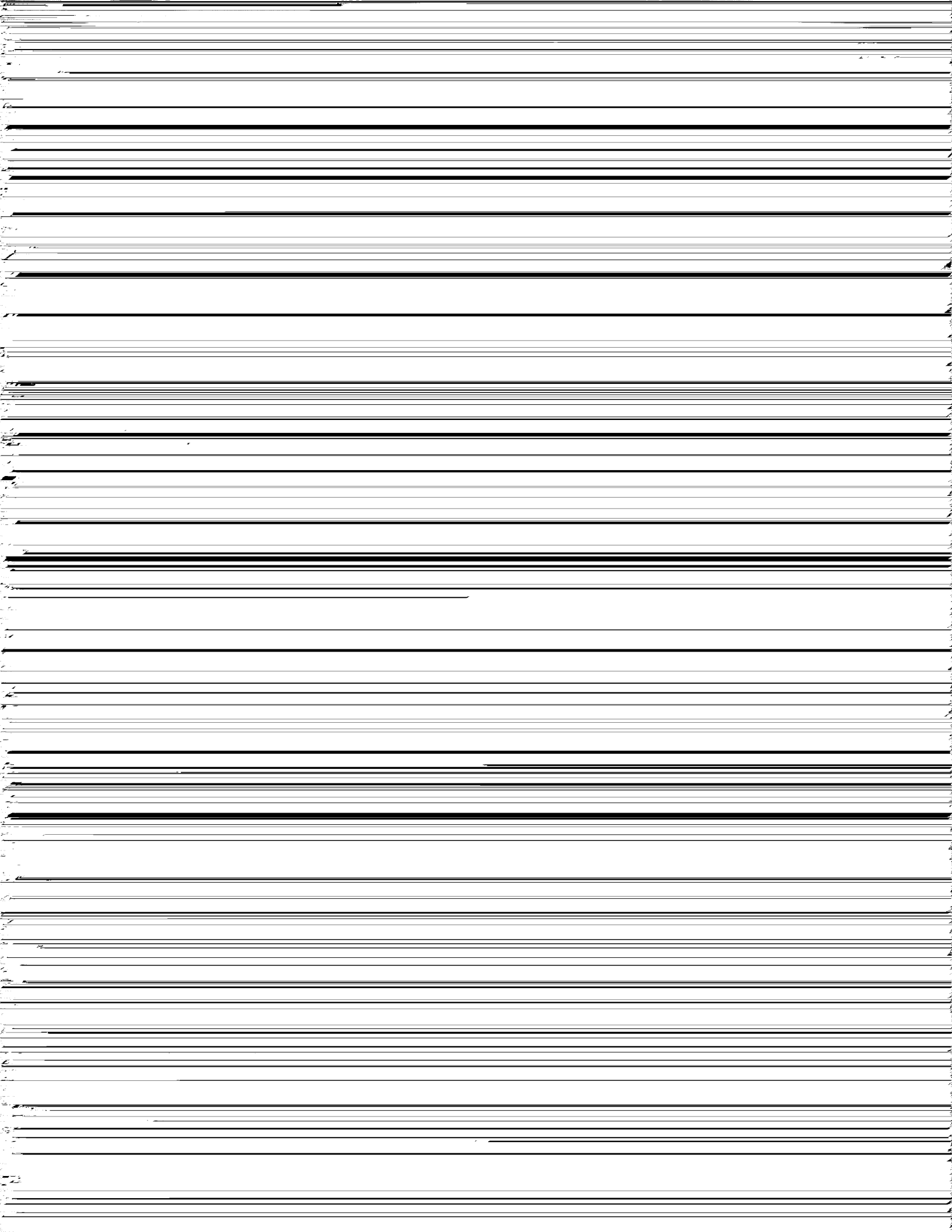
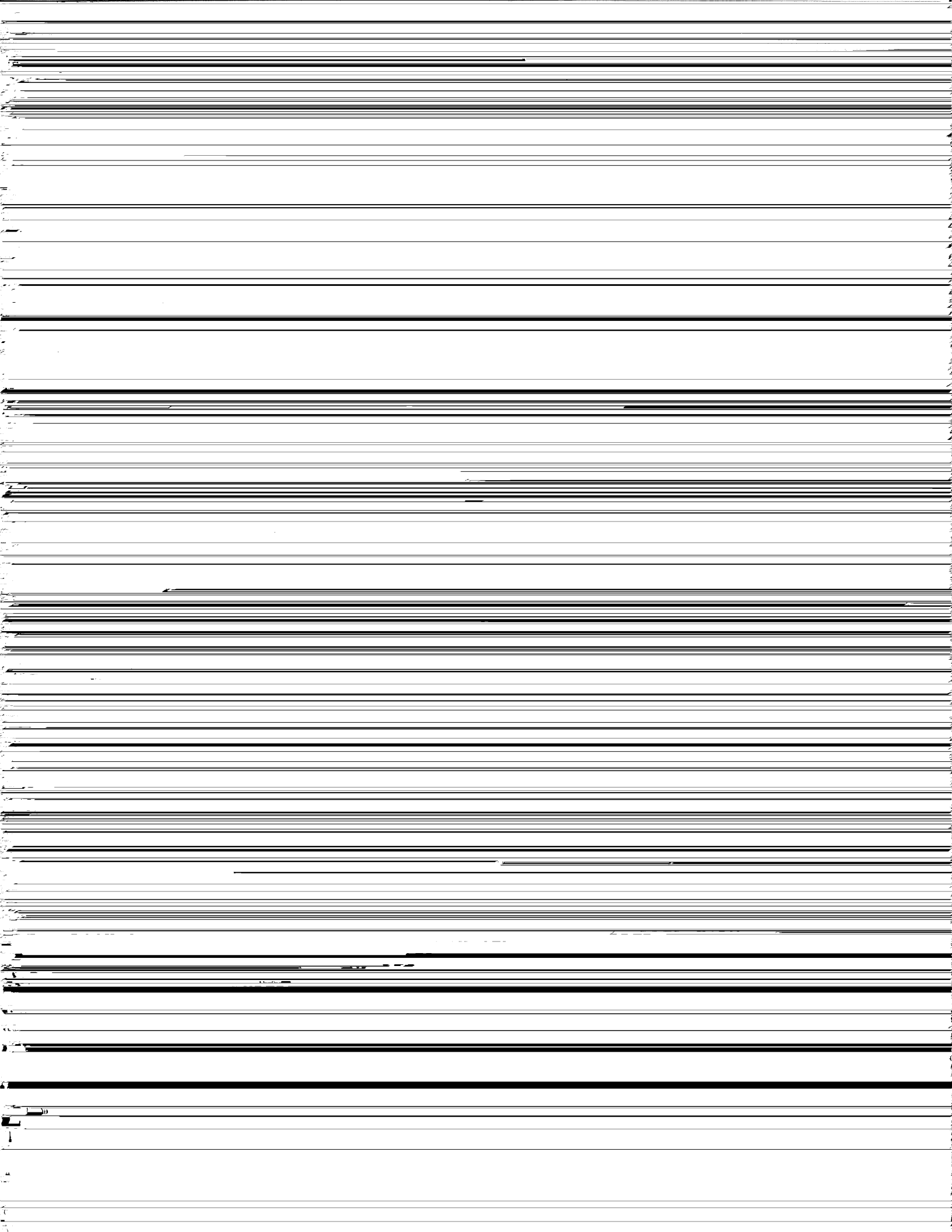

CARTOGRAPHIC PROJECT

A new initiative has allowed microfilming to begin on the maps. This will be a long term project which involves conservation treatment, re-cataloguing, entering descriptions in a searchable database, and finally, filming of the maps. To date G7 (twentieth century plans and descriptions of posts) and G5 (atlases) have been completed and work is under way on G1 (manuscript maps). The new descriptions include latitudes and longitudes, river, lake and post names, information on native sites, and many other helpful details that should make these important cartographic works more accessible. This work has been accomplished by Tammy Hannibal, Faye Bennett, Rob Ridgen, and casual employees Remy Menard and Sylvia Hourie.
