“When I entered my route from home to work into GoManitoba, I found five possible matches right away,” said Mel Marginet, Workplace Commuter Options Program Coordinator with Green Action Centre. “I’m also going to use it to find carpool rides when I’m heading to the Winnipeg Folk Festival or to events at The Forks or Investors Group Field.”

The more people that register with GoManitoba, the more likely each person will find a match. To encourage sign-ups, Green Action Centre is giving out 200+ draw prizes to the first 5,000 Manitobans that register at [GoManitoba.ca](#).

Employers, institutions and municipalities can choose to purchase their own customized subsite on GoManitoba to support carpooling, cycling and transit use (where available) by their community members. Founding partner subsites include: Assiniboine Credit Union, City of Winnipeg, The Forks, Health Sciences Centre, Investors Group, Partnership of the Manitoba Capital Region, Red River College, University of Manitoba, and University of Winnipeg.
